City to Increase Signage Violation Fines June 26

As part of the City of Milton beautification process, keeping the streets and roadways clear of eye clutter is important. The illegal use of right of ways in this manner is becoming a problem. Because of this, the City is asking for no illegal signage to be posted either on utility poles or within city right of ways, including all roadways within the city limits.

“It cost the taxpayers money to remove the signs,” says Sharon Holley, City of Milton code enforcement officer

This complies with Ordinance 1228-06 category one, Illegal Use of Right of Ways, and also in violation of sign ordinance 854, section V – 7.8.

Signage violators will be fined \$100 per violation, increasing from \$50. Violations include, but not limited to: Sales: yard sale/garage sale/estate sale, insurance sales; Rental property: for rent/for sale; Lost signage: lost animals, lost jewelry; Home business: work from home, horseback riding, music instrument, software lessons.
